

Getting to South Africa from the USA

Most of our programs begin on the morning or early afternoon of the first scheduled day, so it's best that you arrive as early in the day as possible. Fortunately, most flights from the USA arrive in the early am to O.R. Tambo International Airport in Johannesburg. If you can't get an early enough flight, we recommend that you arrive the day before and either travel out to Hoedspruit (see the "Getting to Hoedspruit" document) or stay in Joburg and travel to Hoedspruit as early as possible the following day.

In Johannesburg, we recommend that you stay at Sunrock Guesthouse.

Sunrock has a free transport service to and from the airport, by arrangement. They also provide nice and clean rooms, with wifi, a hearty breakfast, and dinner for a small extra cost, also by arrangement.

We fly on South African Airways. They have relatively inexpensive, non-stop flights from John F. Kennedy airport in New York City. You can fly other airlines, and book multiple layovers in different countries, but we'd rather pay a bit extra and get to where we are going as quickly as possible to enjoy our experience, and sometimes it's even cheaper than the longer flights!

It's generally between \$900 and \$1200 for us to book a non-stop, round-trip flight, per person, from JFK to JNB, if we book in advance and are a little bit flexible with our travel days.

Please do not book your flights and accommodation until we confirm that there are enough participants to run a program.
